**In your hand** the Luna 7 doesn't look overly interesting (not that we expect all interconnects to wow us with their beauty). The blue jacket and lightweight plugs seem functional enough, though, and the odds are you'll be hiding this interconnect out of sight...

#### **Won't be out of mind**

But it won't be out of mind, because the Luna 7 gives

a really enjoyable and likable sound. For an extra fiver, there's a greater body and weight to music compared with the Black Rhodium Twist. Play Ellie Goulding's *Anything Could Happen* and the Luna 7 has the track marching along with a confident and controlled delivery.

There's plenty of meat in the drums and also plenty of shine and sparkle to the glistening highs. There's no brightness or sharpness to speak of from the Luna 7, and although weighty there's no suggestion that bass notes sound overblown. The Luna 7 is a great option at this price.

#### **Sound Quality**

From the moment you plug it into your system, the Luna 7 allows a keen and ready-to-please presentation. It isn't over-zealous or too forceful in its approach, though.

Play Guns N' Roses' *You Could Be Mine* and the system pours a bucketload of excitement on the listener with the crashing drum kicks, frenzied guitar play and wailing vocal. But it does so without making the music sound unwieldy or reckless.

It conveys the eagerness and punch of the QED Ruby Anniversary Evolution but with a touch of added tact and guile.

#### **Verdict**

The all-around ability of the Luna 7 means it should sit well with a very wide range of systems – you won't need to worry about how it interacts with the rest of your kit.
